SOME WARM-UP STUFF

- There is an indescribable feeling of making contact with a past caller at a meeting and hearing when they recognize a voice and make that connection. That is one addict helping another!!!
- Our goal is that volunteering for the phoneline should be a pleasurable and stress-free service opportunity

PHONE LINE OBJECTIVES & VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS



PHONELINE OBJECTIVES

Your primary objective is to get them to a meeting
Convey that the NA program works
We care and are willing to help

NA Does Not

- Affiliate with detox units, recovery or halfway houses
- Crusade, solicit or try to persuade anyone to join
- Engage in or sponsor research
- Keep membership records or case histories
- Make medical or psychological diagnosis or provide counseling
- Provide welfare or other social services
- Conduct religious services of any kind
- Engage in education or propaganda about drugs
- Accept money for its services

NA Phoneline Do's

- Do carry an NA message, remember that you are likely to be the first contact the person has with NA.
- Do encourage the addict to attend a meeting by giving them day, time, location and directions.
- Do remember to refer the disclaimer before making any referrals.
 "NA is not affiliated with, nor endorses any related facility or outside enterprise. But, in the spirit of cooperation, I will refer..." (Refer from list of "Suggested Emergency numbers on the last page of these guidelines).
- Do keep an open mind and have the willingness to learn the guidelines of the EASC NA Phoneline.

NA Phoneline Don'ts

- Don't suggest names of hospitals, detox centers, etc as NA does not endorse any facility.
- Don't give medical advice.
- Don't have long conversations on the Helpline.
- Don't give personal opinions as you are representing Narcotics Anonymous.
- Don't take abuse; you do have the right to hang up.
- Don't try to persuade the caller to stop using.
- Don't break anyone's anonymity.

NA Phoneline Don'ts

- Don't give out anyone's personal phone number!
- Don't make promises to addicts calling in about rides to a meeting, a place to stay or any other services
- Don't accept collect calls (e.g., calls from penal institutions)
- Don't answer the Phoneline if you are driving or otherwise unable to focus on responding to the caller.
- DON'T TAKE YOURSELF TOO SERIOUSLY! It is not your responsibility to solve personal problems.

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- 6 months of continuous clean time
- Read the **EASC** Phoneline Guidelines
- Attend the EASC Phoneline Orientation
- Knowledge of the 12 Steps of Narcotics Anonymous
- Knowledge of the 12 Traditions of Narcotics Anonymous (e.g., the only requirement..., our primary purpose..., never endorse related facilities..., non-professional..., no opinion on outside issues..., attraction rather than promotion..., anonymity..., etc.)
- Willingness to contribute personal time during your agreed upon schedule
- Sign up for at least one 3-hour shift per week

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

- You must have access to the most recent Area meeting schedule or be able to search on the <u>EASC website meeting search</u>
- Be willing to contact the Phoneline Coordinator (<u>phone@eascna.org</u>) if your schedule changes
- Be willing to communicate monthly via email reconfirming your schedule and sharing basic information about your experiences
- Be willing to give accurate information about our Fellowship but you can always say "I don't know" if you don't know. You can take the number of the caller if they wish and have another member call them back if necessary

Crisis Situation

• If you have a crisis situation.....

STAY CALM

- We are an information service only, and are not qualified to handle emergency or crisis situations. We do not give medical advice.
- As soon as you suspect a crisis (medical, domestic or other), find out if it is an emergency situation and, if so, what is the nature of the emergency. Has the caller overdosed? Try to get the caller's phone number and address, urge them to call 911 for medical assistance. If you feel that further follow up is necessary you may call 911 to verify that a call has been made.
- If the call is from a family or friend, and the addict has overdosed, have the caller call 911 for assistance. Ask the caller to please call back after the crisis has passed so that we may direct them to a meeting

Drug Identification

 Do not attempt to identify any drugs over the telephone; if you make a mistake somebody could be hurt and you or NA could be held responsible.



Media or Professionals

- Calls from media or other professional should be referred to Public Relations (PR) Chair.
- You can take info:

What is the call about? Name of the person calling? Place the person is affiliated with? Phone number?

Do not give out PR Chair's contact or personal info!

ANSWERING CALLS

- Once a volunteer receives a call from phoneline, Press 1 to accept
- You can Press 1 before the system tells you too
- Answer by saying: "Hi, I'm _____ and I am an addict."
- It is not necessary to say: "NARCOTICS ANONYMOUS"
- The most important thing is to identify yourself
- The caller will not see your personal phone #

ANSWERING CALLS

- Be professional and courteous when answering calls
- If caller becomes verbally abusive/argumentative
 - Ask them to please calm down
- If they continue, it is OK to end the call
- Do not try to argue or give advice
- It is our responsibility to be a positive example of what NA has done for us

RIDES & 12 STEP CALLS

- The EASC Area does not try to manage rides or 12 Step calls with our phoneline
- This is something that groups or individuals within EASC may choose to do.
- If a phoneline volunteer wishes to participate in giving rides or making 12 Step visits, please do so separately from your EASC Phoneline commitment.
- Again, our primary phoneline goal is to help them find a meeting

How Does the EASC Phoneline Work?

- Someone calls EASC phoneline -
 - Option 1 to speak to live addict
 - Option 2 to search for meeting by city or zip
 - $\,\circ\,$ If select 1 $\,$ they may talk to you!!!
 - o If select 2
 - Option 1 to search by City/County
 - Option 2 to search by Zip

- Response of next four meetings is provided by voice on phone and sent as text
 - No longer gives recording of full week of meetings




How Does the EASC Phoneline Work?

- Phoneline grab data from the BMLT (Basic Meeting List Toolbox)
- BMLT powers our eascna.org web search
- Phoneline ONLY returns next four meetings within 50 miles
 - If caller wants something different, they must call back or speak to addict
- In a bigger city (i.e. Tulsa), zip code may be more accurate than city
- Meeting will only return if within 15 minutes of meeting start
 - Meeting starting at 7 PM will NOT be listed after 7:15 PM



How Does the EASC Phoneline Work?

- Anyone can text a city OR zip to phoneline number to receive text of next four meetings 888-749-0017
 - It is a good idea to include state with text search
 - (i.e. Liberty vs Liberty, OK vs Liberty MO vs Liberty tx)
 - If you do not receive a response, it does not mean the system is broken; there may not be a meeting with the 50 mile search radius
 - EASC has increased the search radius to prevent 'no response'
- Since the phoneline is listening for a voice response, background noise can be a problem (especially when 'on speaker')




Easy to Search by

- Click location "NA" for more info


EASCNA.ORG Meeting Search

- eascna.org search ONLY shows meeting in the Plains States Zone (because that is the BMLT database it uses)
- WHY SHOULD YOU CARE? meetings in Arkansas and Missouri do not show up
- EASC Phoneline search returns more options (uses <u>BMLT Tomato</u> <u>database – all meetings using BMLT</u>)
 - This is why you need to include state with city text search
 - Three different results 'Liberty'; 'Liberty, TX'; 'Liberty, OK'
