

Delegate Team Report April 4, 2026

Greetings, the biggest news from the Delegate Team concerns the upcoming World Service Conference, to be held May 2 – 9, 2026, in Woodland Hills, CA, near Los Angeles. Most know that we presented all the motions and other material at the GSA, but we have also made ourselves available to present upon request. We also created an easy-to-use form for submitting both group and individual responses to the CAR & CAT motions, the Literature Survey, and the Discussion Questions.

The date to submit input for the literature survey and discussion questions was April 1st. The input we received has been submitted, but we can still accept votes on the CAR & CAT Motions up to and including April 15, 2026! This cycle, OK Region accepted votes & input from individual members as well as Groups. The tally was weighted as follows: Group Vote = 5 & Member Vote = 1. Based on that system, here are the results that we submitted to NAWS.

Discussion Questions

1) **Gender-Neutral and Inclusive Language:** The question was, “Are we willing to explore these types of changes in our literature? The Weighted Response Was, Yes: 57.3%, No: 42.6%. So, by a slim margin, our Regional Response was yes.

2) **DRT/MAT in NA, Helping Members Take Root**: First question: Does your group or area ask members if they are on MAT when they step up to celebrate or to serve? 93% of respondents said No. Second question: How can we foster unity and respect members recovery process given our differences and how do we get past our personal reservations to help members take root? We had 20 respondents to this question. 19 of the comments were along these lines: Focus on our common purpose and welfare, relying on tradition 3. Be accepting and non-judgmental umm this issue is between an individual their doctor and whoever they choose to share with. One member shared, “A dead addict cannot recover!”

Other NAWS News

Every Conference year, NAWS asks the Delegates to present a Regional Report, which is essentially a snapshot of what is happening in the Region. This report includes: number of meetings (in-person, hybrid & virtual), number of H&I panels, services provided by the Region, and other information. This report was due by the end of February, and with the help of the RCMs, we gathered the information and submitted it on time.

At our conference participant meeting in February, the WB predominantly discussed the CAT motions, but we were also informed:

- 1) NAWS will now have regularly updated price sheets for literature, medallions, etc. There are two sheets which can be accessed in the following ways: 1) A regular price sheet in PDF form can be accessed by going to na.org/pricepdf. And 2) A fillable spreadsheet order form which can be accessed by going to na.org/pricespread.
- 2) WCNA, to be held in Dublin in 2028, coinciding with NA's 75th anniversary, will likely be held in July.

At every WSC, there are ballots for the conference participants to consider candidates to fill positions on the World Board (WB), the Human Resource Panel (HRP) and the WSC Co-Facilitators (Co-Facs). Nominated individuals must go through a difficult and somewhat grueling process to get on the ballot, and we're happy to report that Cindi B., who was nominated by the OK Region, the PSZF, and the WB, has made it onto the ballot as a potential member of the HRP!

But Wait – There's More! Although not necessarily secretive, the process candidates go through during interviews and vetting by the HRP is not generally publicized. That is why many will hear for the first time today that our very own Pam T. was not only nominated by the WB as a candidate to become a member of the World Board, but she has also made it onto the upcoming ballot!

Around the Region

Pam presented the Building Strong Homegroups workshop during the Eastern Area lunch break. They have asked for their 'Regional Learning Day' to be split up and presented at the area so we have a different audience. Pizza, water, and candy were provided, and it was very well received. We can expect to do one or two more within the budget over the course of the year.

On March 5th, the No Grass Group hosted a Mini-CAR Workshop, which was available both in-person and virtually. During the 80-minute session, Tim presented a rapid-fire overview of the CAR Motions, Discussion Questions & Literature Survey. He also popped briefly into the recent WASC meeting to remind and request CAR/CAT votes & input.

Coming up next weekend, we will both present 'Our Common Welfare' workshop at OKRCNA 40, gathering more information on the region's thoughts about the discussion questions as well, and any questions on the motions, hoping we get some additional votes submitted!

Not related, but important, Tim celebrated 40 years of recovery this month. Hip, hip, hooray!

Plains States Zonal Forum

Our last meeting was in February and we went over the Conference Approval Track and motions within. It was a fun weekend. Tim, De, Cindi, and Kaylin attended from the OK region. It was good to receive information on the CAT motions. During the business meeting, we heard from each of the Regions, discussed updating the zonal pamphlet, revising our best practices for hosting zonal meetings, ordering more t-shirts, and preparing budgets for our next meeting. Elections will be held at the July meeting in Nebraska.
